The Book of Psalms part II: Psalm 91 Saturday, April 26, 2025

Whoever dwells in the shelter of the Most High will rest in the shadow of the Almighty.

- 2 I will say of the Lord, "He is my refuge and my fortress, my God, in whom I trust."
- **3** Surely he will save you from the fowler's snare and from the deadly pestilence.
- 4 He will cover you with his feathers, and under his wings you will find refuge; his faithfulness will be your shield and rampart.
- 5 You will not fear the terror of night, nor the arrow that flies by day,

6 nor the pestilence that stalks in the darkness, nor the plague that destroys at midday.
7 A thousand may fall at your side, ten thousand at your right hand, but it will not come near

Questions

- 1. What is the relationship between fending off temptations that are private and temptations that are more in the public eye? In other words, how does one help or hurt the other? Why is it critical to never be accepting of any sin?
- 2. How exactly do we dwell in the shelter of the Most High? How do we let Him cover us with His wings? What are examples of us not letting God cover us with His wings?
- 3. How is the truth of God a shield for us? Doesn't witnessing to the truth make us more vulnerable to injury and attack in today's world?
- 4. How do we explain to children or teens that the psalm promises such protection to the faithful, yet so many very faithful suffered the most? What would be the difference between the arrow that flies by day, and the terror of the night?
- 5. Bonus: what does it mean that the angels will take of thee, that not one of thy feet should stumble? (v11-12)
